



Mr. Alvin Henry Hill

May 14, 1940 - July 3, 2023

Alvin Henry Hill was born on May 14, 1940 at St. Agnes Hospital in Raleigh, NC to the late

Thelma Christina Hill and the late Alvin Hamilton Powell. He was lovingly reared by his

maternal grandmother, the late Lizzie McKinnon Hill in Fayetteville, NC and godparents, the

late Fellington and Maggie Bethune. He spent many summers in Harlem, NY with his mother

and extended family. He transitioned on July 3, 2023 at UNC Hospital in Chapel Hill, NC.

Alvin attended public schools in Cumberland County and graduated from E. E. Smith High

School in 1958. He joined the US Army and served 3 years as a Medical Specialist before being

honorably discharged in 1961. Alvin was a lifelong learner who loved politics, reading, and

creative writing. He was a historian, evident by his Bachelor of Arts degree in History and

Social Studies, which he obtained from North Carolina College at Durham in 1965. Continuing

his studies at NCCU, he pursued a master's degree in Social Studies. He received his minister's

license from First New Horizon Baptist Church in Clinton, Maryland. To know Alvin is to recognize his love for the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, where he served as undergraduate Dean of Pledgees at NCCU. His 'brothers' affectionately called him "Papersack."

Alvin and Jacqueline Jones met at NCCU and married on July 2, 1966. They moved to Craven County, NC where he was employed as a social worker at the Department of Social Services.

After a short time, he joined fellow civil rights workers who founded the Coastal Progress Community Action Program. While there, he managed the Neighborhood Youth Corp Program under President Lyndon Johnson's War on Poverty initiative to develop the economical capacity of local youth in the community. Alvin was later invited to the Robeson County Community Action program to help provide opportunities for young minority law enforcement recruits.

Extensive experience in the community led to his further work in Chapel Hill where he participated in the NC Manpower program as a community organizer. After that program was defunded, he applied for a position through the federal registry and was selected. With this appointment, Alvin moved his family to the Washington, DC area and began his career as program specialist in the Administration on Aging with the US Department of Health and Human Services. His work entailed the management and administration of grants for the

Western states of Washington, Colorado, and the Reservations in Arizona. Alvin's career ended when he suffered a stroke in 1994. But God! He survived for 29 years.

This life-changing event affected his ability to continue his most prided ministry as church

organist. He was trained and grounded at Friendship Baptist Church in Fayetteville. He was the

organist at numerous churches in North Carolina: Synama Grove Missionary Baptist Church in

Creedmoor and Russell Memorial CME in Durham. In Maryland, he found great delight in

playing for various churches: Westphalia United Methodist, Union Bethel AME, and Antioch

Baptist Church to name a few. He was appointed the Minister of Music at Mt. Ennon Baptist

Church, where he organized the gospel and male choruses.

Singing and playing to the glory of God was his lifeline

sibling-like cousins, whom he adored and helped to rear: Gwendolyn Holloman, Kenneth Jones,

Wyche, Stephanie Dyette Taylor, Thomas Powell, and Steve Powell; a host of nieces, nephews,

cousins, and friends.

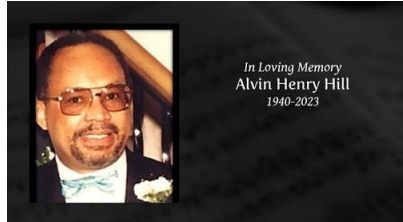
