Angelena “Angie” Hughes Flippen was born on March 9, 1956, in Talladega County, Sylacauga, Alabama.

She was the eleventh of thirteen children of the late Milton Lynear and Willie Pearl Hughes. After High School, Angie moved to Queens, NYC, where she attended York College with a major in biology while working part time in clothing sales. Angie eventually left New York for Nashville, TN. There she worked as a phlebotomist at a Baptist Medical Center. It was also here that she would meet her future husband, Sherreece Flippen. She loved Nashville, and her life flourished there with many friends and work that she enjoyed.

After getting married, Angie and her husband moved to Los Angeles, California. It was there where she would spend most of her adult life, loving and raising her family, spending many hours with her extended family which included most of her twelve brothers and sisters. She and her husband established their home in Panorama City, CA, raising two beautiful boys into wonderful men – Jonathan and Ethan. Angie continued her work in the medical field where she was dedicated to being a voice of comfort and reassurance for the many patients with whom she engaged. Angie lived in San Antonio, TX, for a brief period, enjoying her time there and, as always, making more friends and living a good life. She finally managed to get to Fayetteville, NC, her final earthly home. Here she worked as a

phlebotomist at a Cape Fear Valley Medical Center. While in Fayetteville, Angie volunteered at the Salvation Army and provided services at the Care Clinic. Angie took immense pride in her work, family, and home. Rarely did a weekend go by where she was not hosting a get-together at her home.
