So, it was early Monday morning, January 11, 2021 that our heavenly Father stretched out his gentle hand and beckoned him to his eternal home. Charles H. Brown was born to the late Alex L. Brown and late Virginia Melvin Brown on September 28, 1938 in Robeson County, North Carolina. He was the youngest of 17 children. At an early age, Charles joined Panthersford United Presbyterian Church.

He graduated from Oak Ridge High School in 1957. Upon graduating, he held his first job with Macy's Department Store in New York. He heard the call of duty and joined the 82nd Airborne Division of the United States Army, and became part of the sniper team during the Vietnam War. He served his country for 27 years. Charles later joined Haymount Presbyterian Church, where he was an active worker, and was well known for being ready to help in any capacity.

Later on, Charles returned to school to study and earned a Bachelors degree in Accounting from The University of Maryland. In the mid 90's, he retired out of the workforce from the North Carolina Department of Corrections. He remained an active member of the American Legion Post

202, where he held numerous leadership roles. In addition, Charles was an advent Washington Redskins football team fan.

As we reflect on the life of Charles H. Brown, remembering there is a time to be born, a time to grow, a time to come to our final resting place and a time to reflect. Remembering his love of God and his zest of life shall long be remembered by his loving wife, Nepsy Brown of over 60 years of marriage. Charles also leaves to cherish his memory: three sons, Pierre (Myra Coleman) Brown of Atlanta, Georgia, Quentin (Portia) Brown of Charlotte, North Carolina and Leonard (Kiersten) Brown of Durham, North Carolina; his beloved grandchildren, Deont'e, Jorian, Le'Noira, Kiera and Quentin C.
