Charlie Monroe, Jr., affectionately known as Charles, was born on June 3, 1943, in Swans Creek, North Carolina, to Charlie Monroe, Sr. and Alberta (Taylor) Monroe. Charles earned respect and recognition for his dedication and leadership over his 25-year tenure.

After retiring in 2009, Charles returned to Fayetteville, North Carolina, where he spent his final days surrounded by family, friends, and loved ones. His life was a testament to hard work, loyalty, and an unwavering commitment to those he cared for.
