She was one of my special, childhood friends; we loved each other & looked forward to "playing" together when the opportunity was presented. Our times of play consisted of much creativity based on the availability! We rolled discarded tires after the lifespans had expired on cars. Hopscotch was top-notch in dirt yards that grass was not allowed to grow in, and girls played jack rocks; and marbles to the point of challenging the boys at a game or two. We used long boards (not to be found today) placed and centered over cinder blocks and called that game "jumping board." The Lord took care of us because that was a seriously dangerous game! Jumping rope & climbing trees were in categories of their own. Walking everywhere we went, our bodies got plenty of exercise and we remained slim and trim, with flat tummies and very small waistlines, with the majority of us girls wearing size 3's, 4's, and 5's; a size 10 was considered fat. ("LOL if you must for finding humor in that, as I know the late Mrs. Louise Hooper -Eloise's mom and Porky -Eloise's sister would attest to that.) We literally played, especially during summertime, from sunup until sundown. The clue that it was time to come home was when our mom's would call our names with a loud voice, repeatedly until you got home. \*\*Tears are flowing from my heart & eyes with a knowing that I shall always miss my neighbor, my friend.. .. my childhood playmate -Eloise. She moved away, but we NEVER forgot one another. Over the intermittent times of seeing each other as adults, we imparted big smiles of laughter and hugs. For those of you who did not know Eloise, she did not talk, but we communicated with a language gifted us by GOD. I love 💙 you Eloise, my childhood playmate. Rest peaceably in the arms of JESUS!*
