



MSG George Leonard Winder

December 18, 1929 - November 9, 2025

Retired Master Sargeant George Leonard Winder, of Fayetteville, NC, completed his final change of station on Sunday, November 9, 2025. George gave 28 years of service in the United States Army, and several years as a financial advisor with Primerica after retirement.

George leaves behind his blended family, including wife Mary of 56 years, sons George (Marie), Brandon, stepsons Leslie Burrs (Carol), Stacy Burrs (Lisa), stepdaughter Robin Burrs (Susan), 6 grandchildren, and 6 great-grandchildren.

George was preceded in death by his parents Wesley and Lelah, his brothers Billy, Dana, and John, and his sisters Wana, Dorothy, and Adelaide.

George was born & raised in Philadelphia, PA. In 1969 he married Mary after a long courtship and they moved to Fayetteville, NC., where George continued his Army career from which he retired in 1980.

George was a man of faith. He was active at St. Paul's in the Pines Episcopal Church, where he volunteered. He counted the offering, was head of the Ushers, and was active at most church special events. George even assisted on the Altar Guild. He lent his time and talents until his health dictated differently.

He was a member of the Brotherhood of Saint Andrew. He appreciated receiving communion regularly the last few years of his life when he could no longer attend church in person.

George mentored and advised many young people during his lifetime, and each remembers his kindness, non-judgmental approach, and generous attitude of friendship.

George loved hearing – and telling – a good joke and story and could embellish as well as the next person. Before his health limited his mobility, he enjoyed dining out with his fellow veterans and with Brotherhood buddies.

He was able to spend eleven of the last twelve months of his life at home with the Love of his life, Mary, before completing his final mission at the Fayetteville Veterans Administration Medical Center.

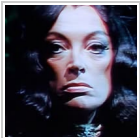

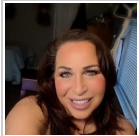
