He joined the U.S. Army after graduating high school where he served as an infantryman until he changed his career field to medic. He worked for many years in leadership roles at Womack Army Medical Center before retiring. Specifically, he championed and steered projects that increased and improved efficiency for veterans in the VA medical system that ensured timely responses and care for the men and women who served and protected the freedom of these United States. Jerry also served in The Gulf War. Jerry served his country admirably and made Fayetteville, North Carolina his home.

Jerry was a compassionate soul, a voice of reasoning in times of chaos and a man who loved his family immensely. He proved the kind of man he was through his actions. In the final days leading to the death of his brother David, his sisters and hospital staff watched as he gingerly shaved and cut his brother's hair in his hospital bed—cracking jokes at David the entire time soliciting some type of response that proved to his brother that he was not alone but surrounded by his family who loved him. The hospital staff watched in admiration.....that's the kind of man Jerry Jordan was. He was a prankster at heart and enjoyed laughter and making others laugh.

He showered his nieces and nephews with love and shared his wisdom in a way that they could understand. He made each of them feel special. He was a

wonderful uncle, a loving brother and a great friend. He really was the balance in our lives and he wasn't afraid to talk about the hard stuff. We will miss him more than anyone could ever imagine.

Jerry was predeceased by both his parents Rosie Lee and Alton, and his brother David. He leaves to cherish his memories five sisters: Shirley (Buffalo), Rose, Tracy, Annette (D.C. Metro Area) and Brenda (Newport News, Virginia), an Aunt, Mary Bell Tinsley, his step-mom Betty Fendley and a host of nieces, nephews and cousins. His ex-spouse, Simone resides in Florida.
