



Rev. Mitchell Earl Ingram

November 23, 1949 - August 21, 2020

Reverend Mitchell Earl Ingram, son of the late Roosevelt and Noetta Ingram, was born on November 23, 1949 in Orrum, NC. He entered eternal rest on Friday, August 21, 2020 at 2:47 a.m. at home, surrounded by his loving and devoted family. Mitchell graduated from Proctorville High School and continued learning throughout his life, attending the Breckenridge Job Corp. Center and Robeson Technical Institute and graduating from Tri-County Bible College in 2003 with his Bachelor of Biblical Studies and in 2006 with his Master of Divinity.

At an early age he joined First Orrum Baptist Church. He was ordained as a Deacon on September 26, 1976. On June 14, 1998 he announced his calling into the Ministry, and, on December 27, 1998, he preached his initial sermon. He was ordained by the Lumber River Baptist Association on April 29, 2001, under the leadership of Pastor Youlander Thompson.

He was an active participant in the Robeson Baptist Union where he held the positions of Third Vice President from 2004-2007, Second Vice President from 2007-2011, First Vice President from 2011-2015, and President from 2015-2019. He devoted over 20 years to teaching inmates in the In and Out Prison Outreach Ministry, Inc. with the State of NC

Department of Corrections. He has received numerous certificates, awards and recognition for the various committees and organizations for which he held membership over the years. For a number of years he served as the

Bible Study Teacher at Mohr Plaza.

Mitchell loved supporting and working in the church. He held various leadership positions including Deacon, Church Clerk, Vacation Bible School Director, Finance Committee member, Sunday School Secretary, and a member of the Men's and Mass Choir, most recently, he served as Assistant Pastor of First Orrum Missionary Baptist Church.

In the 1980's, he was employed with the North Carolina Department of Highway's Construction Department. For 17 years he worked at McLean Wholesale (previously Nash Finch, now Spartan Nash) and was a truck driver until his health forced him into an early retirement. He enjoyed driving trucks and visiting with the workers at the stores he delivered food to and shared his passion for truck driving for all that inquired.

He loved the Lord and loved to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He enjoyed watching Westerns, especially Gunsmoke, In the Heat of the Night, Andy Griffith, the Smithsonian Channel, watching wrestling on Saturday mornings with his girls, reading the bible, talking about old times with family and friends while drinking coffee.

He was preceded in death by his parents; sister, Juanita Fennell; a twin brother who died at birth, Michael Ingram; son-in-law, Kevin Bethea; godchild, Tammie Blackmon; father-in-law, Earnest Liles, Sr., mother-in-law, Nettie Liles; and five brothers-in-law, Alexander Caple, Earnest Liles, Jr., McArthur Jones, Grayland Liles and Lonnie McRae.
