Retired SSgt Alfred Roberts Jr., affectionately known as “Sugar Boy” was born February 27, 1949, in Colquitt, Georgia. He was the third born child to Mr. Alfred Roberts Sr., and Mrs. Ozzie Bell Fuller Roberts.

Alfred “Sugar Boy” Roberts Jr. was educated in the Miller County School System and later served 20 years in the United States Air Force, working in Ground Transportation where he was responsible for the transport of people, supplies, munitions and outsized expeditionary forces, mastering all aspects of ground transportation necessary to get equipment and people where they needed to go.

After serving in the United States Air Force, he served the residents of Fayetteville as a bus driver providing safe, reliable and quality public transportation for Fayetteville Area System of Transit (FAST) for many years until his health started to decline.

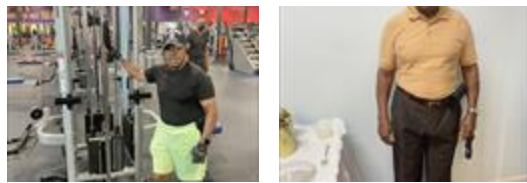
