Pastor Steven J. Lewis was born on August 29, 1975, in Brooklyn, New York to Patricia A. Lewis and Raymond E. Lewis Sr. Steven lived with intention. He didn't waver in his words. He didn't compromise on his values. He was a man of honor who loved fiercely, protected boldly, and gave selflessly. He was loyal without fault to his family and friends.

Steven graduated from Woodbridge High School in Virginia and worked for years alongside his father drafting plans and prints for government transport and equipment. He was an athlete, demonstrating prowess in various sports including basketball, football, and wrestling.

When his family relocated to the DMV area, divine timing would eventually introduce Steven to the love of his life, Tamara Hall-Lewis. Their bond wasn't merely a relationship, it was a covenant rooted in faith, laughter, and shared vision. They shared the kind of love that wasn't forced.
