



Mr. Winfield Carlyle Coachman Sr.

Winfield Carlyle Coachman Sr was born on October 27th, 1935 in Fayetteville, North Carolina. He was the eighth child of nine from the union of Lewis Winfield Coachman and Bertha Bell Carlyle. He garnered the nickname “Buck” due to his active nature – running and jumping like a deer.

He was an exceptionally warm and loving man who guided innumerable young people through their life journey in his role as a father, youth sports coach, church leader, guidance counselor, Boy Scout leader, and member of city council.

He passed away peacefully on January 20th, 2026 in Michigan, with his son Winfield Jr and daughter-in-law Asalyn Coachman by his side. Winfield Sr was preceded in death by his wife of 60 years, Carrie Doris Coachman in 2021.

He is survived by his son, Winfield Carlyle Coachman Jr, his daughter-in-law, Asalyn DuBois Coachman, and his grandchildren, Demetrius Asa Coachman and Stephanie Coachman Florial, along with an extended close-knit family of nieces and nephews.

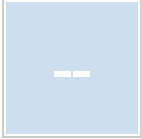
